This warranty shall not apply to goods which have been subject to accidents, negligence or improper installation. Compass Manufacturing International will not be liable for other damages or losses, including, but not limited to: labor charges and/or damages incurred in installation, repair or replacement as well as any other kind of loss or damage. Proof of purchase from the original consumer purchaser must be made available for all warranty claims.

Gather the necessary tools as shown below to complete the installation of this faucet. Some may not be needed depending on the model of faucet you are installing.

Maintenance

Your new faucet is designed for years of trouble-free performance. Keep it looking new by cleaning it periodically with a soft, damp cloth. Avoid abrasive cleaners, steel wool and harsh chemicals as these will dull the finish and void your warranty.

Safety Tips

- If you use solder for the installation of this faucet, please remove the seats, cartridges and washers before soldering. Otherwise the warranty will be voided on these parts.
- Protect your eyes with safety glasses when cutting or soldering water supply line.
- Cover your drain to avoid losing parts.

Important Points

Prior to beginning installation, turn off the cold and hot water lines and turn on the old faucet to release built-up pressure. When installing your new faucet, turn the connector nuts finger tight, then use a wrench to anchor the fitting and a second wrench to tighten the nut one additional turn. Connections that are too tight can compromise the integrity of the system. Wrap all threaded connections with teflon tape. Always wrap in a clockwise direction.

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Troubleshooting

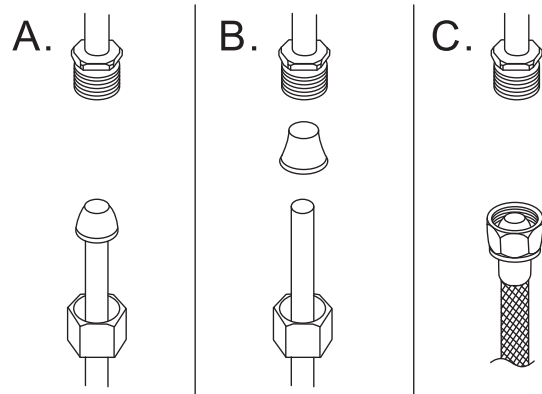
If the instructions were followed carefully and the faucet does not work properly, try these corrective steps.

Problem	Cause	Action
Leaks underneath the handle (#1).	Cartridge (#5 or #26) has come loose.	Turn off the water supplies. Remove the handle (#1) and tighten the cartridge (#5 or #26). Reinstall the handle (#1).
The water will not shut off completely.	Dirty or damaged cartridge (#5 or #26).	Turn off the water supplies. Remove the handle (#1), lock nut (#4), and cartridge (#5 or #26). Check the ceramic disk for dirt and damage. If the cartridge (#5 or #26) is dirty, soak it in warm white vinegar for 4 hours. Every 30 minutes, while the cartridge (#5 or #26) is completely submerged, turn the stem on and off 10 times. If the cartridge is damaged, replace the cartridge (#5 or #26). Reinstall the cartridge (#5 or #26), lock nut (#3) and handle (#1).

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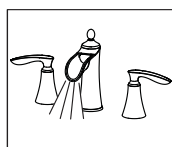
Configuration

Connect to water supply lines with either:

- (A) 3/8" O.D. Copper tubing (ball nose risers with the coupling nuts or;
- (B) 3/8" Copper tubing (no ball) with supplied tube head interior connector or;
- (C) IPS faucet connectors (1/2")

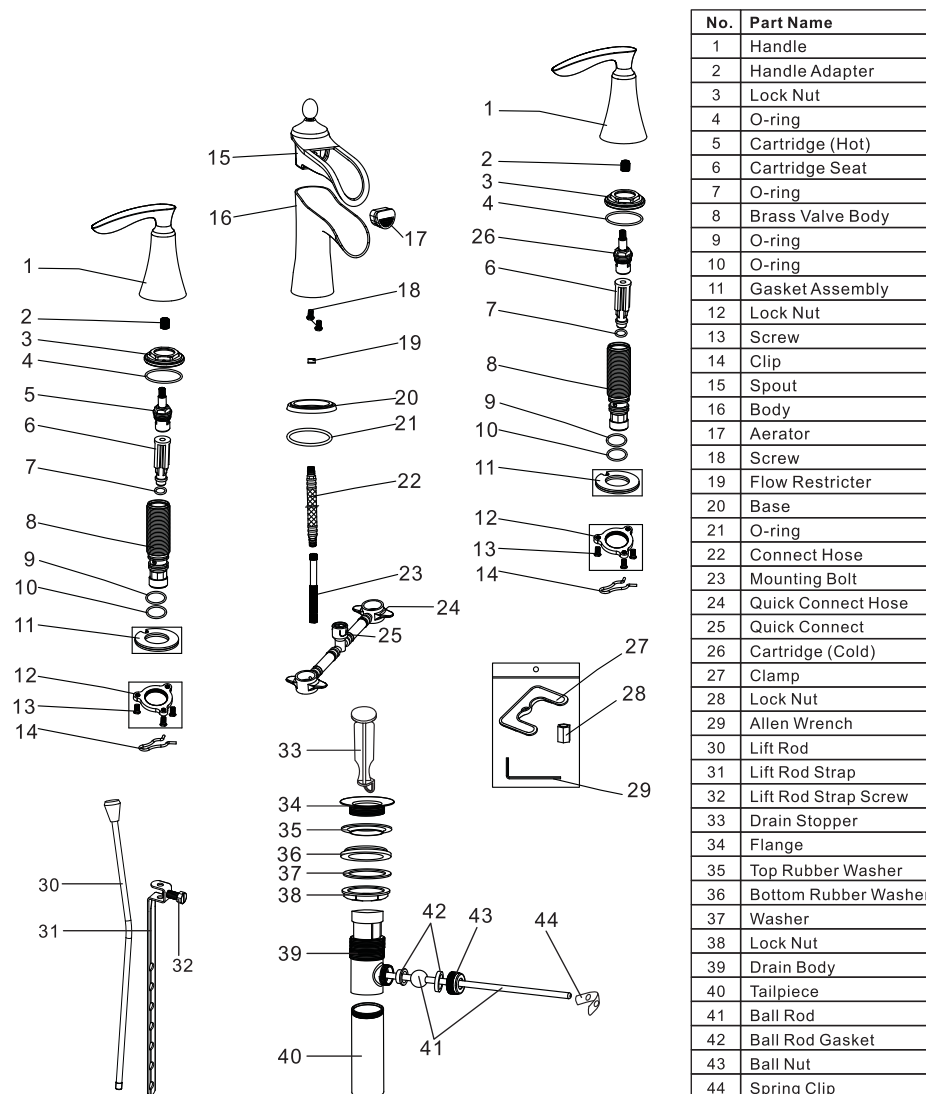


Let both hot and cold water run for one minute.

Test system for leaks.

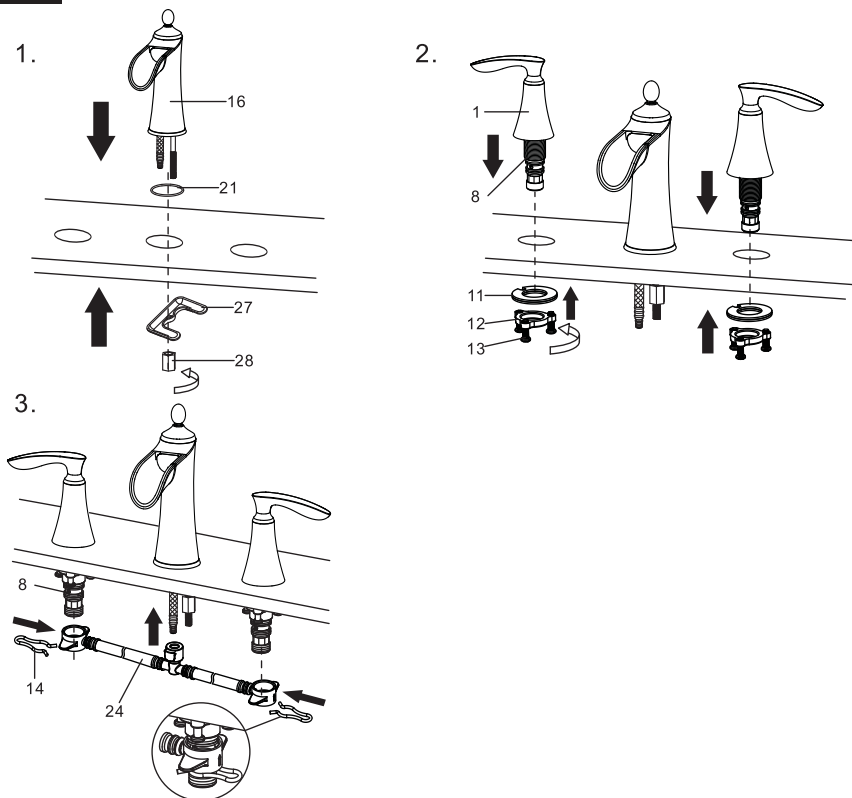
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Parts Diagram



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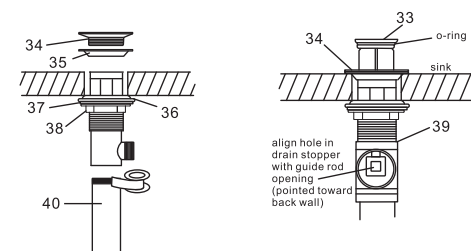
Installation Instructions



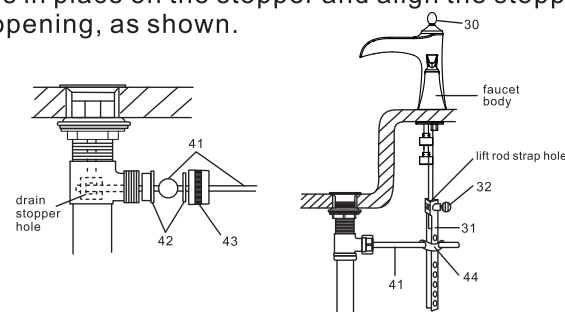
1. Verify the O-ring (#21) is in place on the body (#16) and insert through the center hole. From underneath, assemble the clamp (#27) and screw on the lock nut (#28). Tighten the lock nut (#28) using a basin wrench.
Note: Optional - Add silicone sealant under body (#16) to prevent leaks.
2. Insert the brass valve body (#8) through the far left hole (hot water side). From underneath, assemble the gasket assembly (#11) and screw on the lock nut (#12). Use a screw driver to tighten the screws (#13). Repeat this step for the far right hole (cold water side). See the diagram for a visual.
Note: Optional - Add silicone sealant under handle (#1) to prevent leaks.
3. Position the quick connect hose (#24), as shown. Connect the quick connect (#25) to the connect hose (#22). The quick connect (#25) is fully inserted when a light click or popping sound is heard. Use clip (#14) to attach the quick connect hose (#24) to the brass valve body (#8).

4. Disassemble the drain stopper (#33), flange (#34), and top rubber washer (#35).
5. Insert the drain body (#39) into the drain hole from under the sink. Reinstall the flange (#34) and top rubber washer (#35) to the drain body (#39) and hand tighten.
6. From under the sink, install the bottom rubber washer (#36), washer (#37) and tighten the lock nut (#38) until firmly against the sink base.
7. Disassemble the tailpiece (#40) from the drain body (#39) and apply Teflon tape clockwise. Reinstall the tailpiece (#40) to the drainbody (#39).
8. Reinstall the drain stopper (#33) into the drain body (#39). Ensure the O-ring is in place on the stopper and align the stopper hole with the guide rod opening, as shown.



9. Remove ball nut (#43) and ball rod gasket (#42) from the ball rod (#41). Insert ball rod (#41) into the drain body (#39) and the hole in the drain stopper (#33). Reinstall the ball rod gasket (#42) and ball nut (#43).
10. Insert lift rod (#30) through hole on faucet body. Connect ball rod (#41) to lift rod strap (#31) using spring clip (#44) to hold and adjust.
11. Attach lift rod strap (#31) to the lift rod (#30) by inserting the lift rod (#30) through the lift rod strap (#31) hole. Adjust the lift rod (#30) to the correct height and hand tighten lift rod strap screw (#32).
